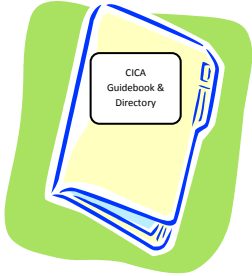

ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

Included in your new CICA Guidebook is a section devoted to the ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE. Please review this section, especially if you are planning any changes to your home or outbuildings. It reminds us that all planned construction of dwellings, additions, garages, permanent-foundations, outbuildings, sheds, porch's and decks must be approved by the Architectural Review Committee before construction begins. Changes affecting driveway drainage also requires CICA review.

A good rule of thumb would be that if what you are contemplating requires a county permit, then it requires ARC approval.

The process is relatively simple and should be started as early as possible, by calling Bill Dryden, Chairman (287-9598), Gail Berkeihiser (287-9439) or Ken Knapp (287-0824). We thank you for your cooperation.

CICA HARBOR REPORT

Another boating season is coming to a close. We have started to pull moorings. Please notify the Harbor Master as you pull your boat for the season. Starting October 13th we will pull moorings that do not have a boat on them. If you intend to use your mooring and do not want it pulled early, please notify the Harbor Master. Final mooring pull day and delivery is November 1st.



Just a reminder all dinghies, kayaks, sunfish, and catamarans in the Harbor area should be identified with your name or lot number.

A Caution About Snow Plowing



As winter approaches, so does the chance that CI will experience ice and snow. Our dedicated group of snow plow drivers do a great job of keeping our roads passable, even in severe weather, but just in case you don't know..... The tractor does not handle any better under snow and ice conditions than your ordinary automobile or pick-up truck, so please avoid leaving your vehicle parked on a Chesapeake Isle road when we are expecting a snow storm large enough to require plowing. The same holds true for parking a vehicle (or storing a boat) too close to the roadway at the front of your driveway or property. Let our drivers concentrate on their job, without the extra concern of possibly damaging a vehicle.

At the end of this newsletter, you will find a contract form for those of you interested in having CICA plow your driveway this winter. Payment is due by November 15th, and limited to the first 35 contracts received.

Roads Resurfacing Committee Feasibility Study

At the Chesapeake Isle annual meeting in 2007 a vote was taken that requested the CICA Board establish a committee to evaluate the feasibility of paving the Community roads as private roads. In 2008 a committee was formed with the current membership being:

- Don Manges (Chair), Bill Day, Bill Chase, Gail Berkeihiser, Paul Pudlinski, and John Bates. The Board representative is Brian Claire.
- The Committee's first meeting was at the end of April of 2008. The status of the road paving feasibility study is as follows:
 - It has been determined that the best and most cost effective form of paving is asphalt.
 - Tar and Chipping can be done but it is just as expensive and has a much shorter life expectancy.
 - The cost for paving the roads, at the current time, is in the area of \$500,000 to \$600,000.
 - How this is paid for, and who should pay what, is being evaluated.
 - Paving the roads has no impact on property taxes.
 - Environmental issues confirm that the 'asphalt millings' are hazardous but propose little risk. However, dermal contact, ingestion, and breathing of the dust should be avoided.

At the 2008 annual meeting, after the above information was presented, a straw vote was taken as to whether or not to continue the study to come up with a firm proposal. It was decided that the

Committee should continue to work to come up with a proposal for paving and financing the roads. This study is underway with a proposal for Board review expected by the end of October 2008.

**Chesapeake Isle Seasonal Private Driveway
Snow Removal Contract**

Chesapeake Isle Civic Association will plow Member's private driveways during the winter beginning in December, 2008 and ending in March, 2009 for a seasonal fee subject to the following conditions:

1. It is intended that first priority be given to clearing snow from the community roads.
2. Property Owner/Member must be present when plow committee stakes driveway.
3. Chesapeake Isle Civic Association will *not* be responsible for any damage caused by plowing operations
4. Driveways will be plowed only if snow is three or more inches in depth
5. A standard driveway is considered to be sixty feet or less in length
6. Seasonal fees for plowing a standard driveway (CICA MEMBERS ONLY) is \$75.00
7. Fees for unusual driveways will be negotiated.
