



*Self-help community...* Even if you are new here, you have probably heard this term numerous times when people describe our neighborhood. In fact, I feel like I say it until I am blue in the face. However, we really are sustained by the work of so many residents who take time out of their busy schedules to work for the benefit of the entire community. We are able to keep our annual dues so low because of the efforts of residents who volunteer an unbelievable amount of their time and talents to maintain our community areas and community property.

But sometimes, the resources we have within our community are just not enough. One of our biggest challenges has been road maintenance. Due to the overwhelming amount of manpower required, as well as the equipment needs, last year's Board presented the option of hiring an outside contractor to come in, regrade the roads where necessary, and roll the millings with their machines.

At the August Annual Meeting, all lot owners in Chesapeake Isle were given the opportunity to vote on the proposed Annual Budget, which was included in the last newsletter. This proposed budget included the cost of this contractor. It also included an additional line item for paving one or two areas that our crew has difficulty maintaining with millings. For those who were not able to attend this meeting, please note that community members approved both of these items. The maintenance fees for next year will therefore be \$211 per taxable lot, and invoices will be sent in January (as always). The two problem areas were paved in September, and the Board projects that we will hire the contractor to do their work in the Spring. In the meantime, Bill Chase, the Roads chair, will continue to spread the millings that we currently have and perform routine maintenance.

The Annual Meeting also marks a new year for the Board of Directors. As many people turned over their duties to others, I want to extend a huge thank you to these people who have dedicated so much of their time to the community:

1. Thanks to outgoing Board members Brian Clare, Sonny Hayes, Janet McKenna, and Art Wood for your many years of service. Newly elected Board members Ed Campbell, Joe Greenfield, Don Manges, and James Richardson have some difficult shoes to fill!
2. Thanks to Bill Tucker for his many hours fulfilling the role of Treasurer during the past few years; Bill will now serve as Vice President and Andrea Gilde will serve as the new Treasurer.
3. Thanks to Andrea Gilde for her many years of producing the quarterly newsletter and for serving as Secretary the past 2 years; John Trainor will be taking over all of these duties.
4. Thank you to Gary Gilde for serving as the Beach chairperson for almost 6 years; Joe and Jennifer Greenfield are the new co-chairs.
5. Thanks to Art Wood for his service as Harbormaster; Bob Hartman and Jim Duckenfield will serve as the new Harbormasters, although Art will still be involved in the boat ramp project.
6. Babs Manges will serve as the new Community Events chairperson, as I am stepping down from that role.
7. Thank you to Bud and Mihaela Godby for all of the years of work producing CICA clothing. (Please refer to the new Board listing and Committee chair listing at the end of this newsletter.)

Not only am I thankful for all of the efforts of these people, I am excited about all of the community members who are taking new roles, some of whom have never been able to volunteer before. We have a new Board. We have a new year. It is a time for evaluating our needs as a community, improving what we have, and working together for the betterment of the beautiful place we call home.

I encourage you too to get involved. Even if you have never stepped foot at an event because it is "not your thing" or if you have never had the time to come out and help, I urge you to do what you can—big or small. We need new people. There is a lot you can do. Come to Board meetings. Join a committee. Come out on clean-up day; there are jobs for all ages. Go to the harbor and help on mooring day; "younger" folks are desperately needed! Help with community communications. The list goes on and on. E-mail or call me and I will be more than happy to find something that you can do! Not only does it save the community money, but you might also find that it is fun.

I know a lot of people move to the Isle to get away from it all, and that's okay. But, if you have a problem, I urge you to become part of the solution. That's part of what the self-help community concept is all about. It takes a lot of work and effort to operate this community, but what it all boils down to is that, at the end of the day, we are all just a bunch of volunteers who try our best to make Chesapeake Isle a wonderful place for all of us. ### ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW

It reminds us that all planned construction of dwellings, additions, garages, permanent-foundations, outbuildings, sheds, porch's and decks must be approved by the Architectural Review Committee before construction begins. Changes affecting driveway drainage also requires CICA review.

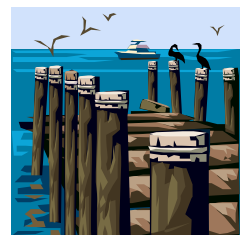
A good rule of thumb would be that if what you are contemplating requires a county permit, then it requires ARC approval.

### IT IS COMING...SNOW, SNOW, SNOW

## Chesapeake Isle Seasonal Private Driveway Snow Removal Contract

Chesapeake Isle Civic Association will plow the private driveways of CICA members during the winter beginning in December, 2009 and ending in March 2010 for a seasonal fee, subject to the following conditions:

1. It is intended that first priority be given to clearing snow from the community roads.
2. Property Owner/Member must be present when plow committee stakes driveway.
3. Chesapeake Isle Civic Association will *not* be responsible for any damage caused by plowing operations
4. Driveways will be plowed only if snow is three or more inches in depth
5. A standard driveway is considered to be sixty feet or less in length
6. Seasonal fee for plowing a standard driveway (CICA MEMBERS ONLY) is \$75.00
7. Fees for unusual driveways will be negotiated.
8. Contract must be signed and returned by November 15, 2009 with full payment to

No driveways will be plowed without a signed contract and full payment. Only 35 contracts will be accepted in accordance with CICA's equipment and manpower capabilities. Contracts will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, which will be determined by the postmark date on the returned contract.

9. Tractor will plow as close as possible. The driver will not do hand-shoveling
10. Contract must be approved by a member of the plow committee at the time of staking.
11. Fees are non-refundable
