
USCG Vessel Identification Stickers

According to the USCG, one responsibility of owning a small watercraft is to make sure it is secure on racks and has an identification label. If foul weather pushes it into the water, the USCG may have to launch a "search and rescue." Orange USCG labeling stickers on vessels reduce unnecessary searches and help the harbormaster contact owners if a stray vessel is found. If you need a sticker, please contact Joe.

Rogues Harbor Closure (2025) and a Plan for Chesapeake Isle Harbor 2025 BOATING SEASON IMPORTANT HARBOR INFORMATION **YOU WILL NEED OUR LOCK CODE TO ACCESS OUR BOAT RAMP**

Elk Neck State Park has announced that Rogues Harbor will be closed from May 1 - December 31, 2025, for construction of a break water barrier.

We contacted the Park Services Supervisor, and she informed us that they will be communicating this closure via social media (including Facebook), website, reservation list, and a physical sign at the Rogues Harbor entrance. However, we are still concerned (due to the many boaters' forums available) that some may suggest that the Chesapeake Isle harbor ramp is an alternative option for the general public and non-Chesapeake Isle residents/property owners. **Please refrain from offering Chesapeake Isle amenities such as the boat launch, harbor, beach and picnic areas via social media platforms as alternates to the closed Rogues Harbor area.**

After an extensive discussion at the March Chesapeake Isle Board meeting, the Board decided to install two posts and a chain at the top of the boat launch ramp. The chain will be secured with a combination lock, using the same code used in other parts of the community. To ensure visibility and safety, a reflective sign and fluorescent tape will be hung from the chain to help prevent damage to vehicles. This change will be communicated to the Chesapeake Isle community through multiple channels to ensure that all residents and property owners are aware of the new setup and the reasons behind it.

We will also be placing signage at the entrance to the Harbor & Beach/Pavilion Road stating that the use of these areas is for **Chesapeake Isle members only**. All vehicles must visibly display a CICA sticker—vehicles without one may be towed or booted. (See boot image on right.)

If you do not know the code, please contact Janice Beiter (410-688-4259) or Mike Beiter (410-808-1074). You will need to provide your name, address, phone number, and email address. You will need to be current with the payment of your 2025 Community Maintenance Fees.

Living Shoreline Work at the CICA Harbor

Our approved FY25 budget included our Shoreline Erosion Project (Living Shoreline) with the goal of decreasing future erosion at the community's waterfront in the harbor area. The areas of concern were the last 170 feet of the downstream community property and 80 feet upstream of the boat ramp by the dinghy racks. Our living shoreline plans were submitted by Kingfisher in November, and we received our permit in February. **The project work will begin in the May timeframe and a barge will be placed in our cove area to handle the work on the south side.** The committee will now be pursuing any grant opportunities since they require an approved permit prior to submittal.

Chesapeake Isle History Earliest Residents and Landholders 1884 to 1900

Background

This is part 6 on the history of our community. Previous issues can be found in The Isle News on our website. In the middle of the 1800's what is now known as Chesapeake Isle was owned by the prominent Whitaker family. George Price Whitaker in particular stood out as a farmer, industrialist and Ironmaster. Cecil Whitaker, his youngest son, while visiting the family property here died in a tragic boating accident in 1883. The property then was passed on to his widow, R.E. Jamar. Alexander Wilson acquired the property later. Properties on the Lower Elk Neck Peninsula The few large plantations here were gradually divided up into smaller farms after the Civil War. Several farms were owned by wealthy people as were the plantations. The Whitaker's owned multiple properties who either rented them, used them as a summer residence, or were occupied by other family members. This is also true of the Wilson family.

Alexander Wilson

He appeared to be the patriarch of the Elk Neck clan (b.1813, d.1875). In 1862 he enlisted in the Army during the Civil War under an alias name of Private Henry Ward and was discharged in 1865. He was listed as a slave holder here in 1850 with 6 enslaved people. He was married twice. He first married Catherine Maudin and had 6 children. His second marriage was to Milcha Crouch and had two children. He is buried in Hart's Church Cemetery in Elk Neck.



From the large peach orchard of Mr. Fletcher Wilson, at Turkey Point, which contains forty thousand trees, and from which with a half crop eighty to a hunddred thousand baskets should be gathered, it is thought, not ten thousand baslet's will be gathered, and these of inferior quality.

Cecil Whig Aug.11,1883

—The "catch" of herring at the fisheries in this county has recently been larger than for many years past. On last Monday, Mr. J.F. Wilson made a haul at "Guilders Holo", on the North East River which was so large that he was unable to land the seline, and after fishing out enough to load two pungles, was obliged to lower the cork line and let a large number escape. The number of herring in this remarkable haul was estimated at 400,000, besides 5,000 shad

The Cecil Whig May 8, 1880

In Trouble with The Law

Captain J. Fletcher Wilson

J. Fletcher (b.1837, d.1907) was the son of Alexander and Catherine who inherited the properties here. He was the steamship captain of "Commerce" and "Roanoke" besides other vessels of different grain capacities. He had one of the largest fisheries in the state. The captain lived in Georgetown, Kent County toward the end of his life. Although in ill health, in 1907 he bought another farm in Cecil County for \$12,000 but sadly died the next day. While talking with a friend he was stricken and passed before a physician could reach him. Newspaper clippings reveal some interesting events that happened during his ownership. One of the largest peach orchards in the region covered the property. The peach crops gradually succumbed to disease and the peach economy died off. There was a great abundance of fish in the upper Chesapeake at the time. Fletcher's fisheries often made local news.

"Mr. Jackson Pierce, of North East, informed Justice Lewis of violation of the law regarding setting of pound nets by parties on the North East River. Sheriff Dunbar visited the locality and found the nets complained of to be the property of Mr. Fletcher Wilson. Three or four in number were located about a mile and a half north of the lighthouse. The informer claimed that the law forbade such traps on the North East River and anywhere North of Pooles Island on the Bay. The parties were summoned for a hearing, and it took place on Thursday. Justice Lewis named Saturday as the time when he would make his ruling on the matter. If the ruling went against Mr. Wilson, the penalty for violation was \$25 to \$50 and the confiscation of the nets which were required to be sold. One half of the proceeds and one half of the fine would be awarded to the informer"! (May 20, 1882. The Cecil Whig.) It's not known the outcome of the court ruling. The writer of this article made light of the situation regarding the penalty for violation. In paraphrasing his editorial comment, he joked: "it sometimes can be quite profitable to rat on a neighbor". A shark 9 feet long and weighing

"Just When You Thought That It Was Safe To Go Back In The Water"

The tag line above is from the Jaws 2 movie in 1978. This may seem appropriate for our shores here In Chesapeake Isle! A great blue shark was caught in a seine net here in August 1933 at the summer residence of Dr. Fin Sparre who owned Beaver Dam Farm (now Chesapeake Isle). It weighed 400 pounds and was 8 ½ feet long. It was put on ice and admission to see it was charged at the Red Mans carnival in North East. This apparently was not an isolated incident as described in the newspaper clipping shown here from 1891. Fletcher Wilson had previously caught an even bigger one at 9 feet long in his pound net, coincidentally, it weighed the same.



Planning an Exterior Project in Chesapeake Isle?

Under the direction of the Board, the purpose of the Architectural Review Committee (ARC) is to ensure compliance with the Restrictive Covenants and other residential land use standards and guidelines. ARC is responsible for reviewing and approving or rejecting any changes to individual properties that impact the nature of the property or has the potential to encroach on property lines or affect runoff. The overall goal of ARC is to protect and preserve the diverse residential nature of Chesapeake Isle. For all exterior projects, the property owner must comply with all County regulations, then submit their project to ARC. ARC is a Board-appointed committee whose Charter and Procedures are approved by the Board of Directors. If you are planning a project, please review the guidance documents on our website and reach out to Mike Beiter, ARC Chair, for assistance BEFORE any work starts.


