## **Free Boat Safety Inspection**

We are working with the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary to offer courtesy safety inspection for our community. Because most CI boat owners keep their boat on a trailer, inspections will be offered on land OR at the end of the fishing pier. The condition and registration of your trailer is insignificant for this event.

**Why Receive a Vessel Safety Check?** Safety! The peace of mind that your boat meets federal and Maryland safety standards and that in an emergency, you will have the necessary equipment to save lives and summon help.

**What if I Don't Pass?** If your boat does not pass this inspection, no citation is issued. Instead, you are given a written report on how to correct any deficiency.

**What Type of Items Are Checked?** Life Jackets, registration and numbering, navigation lights, ventilation, fire extinguishers, distress signals (flares, horn, etc.), battery cover and connections

All these items are required by state and federal laws and, if missing or non-operating, could result in a citation if your vessel is inspected by the Maryland Marine Police or U.S. Coast Guard.

**What Should I do to Participate?** Email [CICAMMSI@gmail.com](mailto:CICAMMSI@gmail.com) and provide the following information:

- Your preferred Saturday in May (We favor May 2 or May 9—not May 16.)
- Size and type of boat (i.e. 22' center console)
- If your boat will be on a trailer or in the water

# Community Concerns Brought to the CICA Board of Directors

## Community Pranks and Vandalism

The Board has received reports of multiple “ring-and-dash” pranks and several incidents of property vandalism in various areas of the CICA community in recent months. Earlier in the season, similar incidents involving damage to holiday decorations were also reported. While all these incidents occurred on private property and are outside the Board’s purview, this information is being shared for community awareness.

In several cases, the juveniles involved have been identified through security camera images and their parents were notified. A resident has compiled and retained a summary list of reported incidents for reference.

Because all incidents occurred on private property, the CICA Board does not have legal authority over these matters; they must be handled by local law enforcement. Homeowners are advised to promptly report suspicious activity or property damage directly to the Cecil County’s Sheriff’s Office (410-996-5500). Police have advised that images not be shared publicly and minors not be named.

The Board hopes this behavior will cease. Parents and guardians are strongly encouraged to monitor their children’s activities, remind them to stay off private property for their safety, and reinforce respectful, responsible behavior within our community.

### Unkind Neighbor Behavior

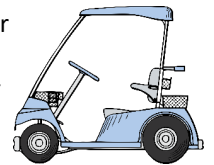
The Board has received reports that are considered neighbor disputes. The Board does not intervene in these instances; however, we would like to offer a brief reminder about community expectations.

Keeping disturbances to a minimum and interacting respectfully helps support a safe and welcoming environment for everyone.

### Leash Up for Safety

Even the friendliest, best-trained dog can react unexpectedly to a squirrel, car, or noise. Keeping your dog leashed helps ensure:

- **Safety:** It protects your dog from traffic, wildlife, and potential fights with other animals.
- **Respect:** Not everyone is comfortable around dogs, including children and those with fears or allergies.
- **Community Guidelines:** Dogs should be kept under control and on a leash in public spaces to protect everyone.

## Reserve Accounts

### What are Reserves?

Reserves refer to a separate fund or account used to cover the costs of major repairs and replacements. These funds are distinct from the operating budget, which covers day-to-day expenses. Reserve funds are essentially the community's savings, ensuring they can address significant, non-routine projects without sudden special assessments (Google AI).

## The Harbor Living Shoreline Project

For the past two years, the shoreline at the Chesapeake Isle Harbor has demanded attention and money. This spring, the project will be completed with final plantings installed. Paying for the project impacted the FY25 and FY26 Community Maintenance budgets as well as earlier budgets in which reserves were put aside for shoreline erosion work. Below is a financial report for your information.

We look forward to the completion of this project. The use of reserves and planning by the Board of Directors ensured that the funding was available when needed to pay for this important project.

## Important Update about Tree Removal in Chesapeake Isle Most of Chesapeake Isle is in the Critical Bay Area

### 1. Do you know if your home and/or lot is in the Critical Area of the Chesapeake Bay watershed?

The majority of homes/properties in Chesapeake Isle are in the Critical Area - yours may be one of them. The set back is 1000 ft. NOT 100 ft. There are specific laws in Maryland regarding properties in the Critical Area. ### 2. Did you also know that there are numerous other restrictions on properties within the Critical Area?

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR) governs the Critical Area program for Maryland residents. The [DNR site](#) has more information for you to review.

### 3. Did you know that, IF your property is in the Critical Area, any tree removal requires the approval of Cecil County Planning and Zoning?

Review the [County website](#) for information about tree removal and the application. You can be fined thousands of dollars for violating these regulations regarding tree removal and other prohibited modifications to the land. The County has aerial photos archived to determine what's changed on your property. When applying for the tree removal permit, you will need to upload a copy of your property plot plan and photos of the tree(s) you would like to remove.



## Driveways and the Right of Way (ROW)

Spring is a good time to remind neighbors of the requirements when re-blacktopping or paving a new or rebuilt driveway regarding the drainage. Most driveways in the community require either an underdrive drainpipe or a swale of the paving that would match the contour of the ROW. The two pictures as examples of approved driveways.

As a reminder, please note the following information:

- (1) The CICA-owned ROW consists of the 20-foot-wide road and the 15-foot-wide shoulders on each side of the roadway.
- (2) The community designed and built the ROWs in a particular way to handle drainage when we paved our roads. Specifically, grass was purposefully installed in the ROWs to improve the overall drainage infrastructure, especially in areas where we experienced significant run-off issues, to maintain the integrity of the road.
- (3) Any modifications to the ROW may affect this drainage design and is therefore strictly prohibited without prior review and approval from the CICA Architectural Review Committee (ARC). Please therefore contact Mike Beiter, ARC Chairperson, at [mikebeiter@aol.com](mailto:mikebeiter@aol.com) if you have intentions to modify or change the community ROW in any way.
- (4) CICA reserves the right to require property owners who have altered the ROW or any CICA-owned property without prior ARC permission to return it to its original form.
